

## DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR A DOMINICA CITIZENSHIP APPLICATION

- 1 One complete and notarized copy of Application Forms D1, D2, D3 and D4 for all applicants, children included.
- 2 Two Notarised copies of Application form 12 required on each applicant, children included.
- 3 Letter of Employment, or if self-employed, corporate documents and your latest Audited Financial Statement.
- 4 Two Notarised copies of the Birth Certificate for each applicant.
- 5 Proof of residential address for the Main Applicant.
- 6 Certified Copy of Military Record if applicable.
- 7 Bank statements for the last 12 months.
- 8 Original signed reference letter from your bank, required of the main applicant. It must show you have held an account for a minimum of two years.
- 9 Two original personal references required on all applicants over 18 years. They must be from different referees and must have known the applicant for a minimum of five years.
- 10 Two original personal references, required on all applicants over 18. They must be from different people and have known the applicant for five years. A paragraph must be included on the person writing the reference.
- 11 Police record from your country of birth, and from your country of residence if different for all applicants over 16. Children aged 12 -15 must have a sworn affidavit that they do not have a criminal record.
- 12 Notarized Marriage certificate/and notarized dissolution of marriage (if applicable).
- 13 Certified copy of Passport, driving license, residency permits and national identity cards if applicable.
- 14 Letter of application addressed to the Minister requesting citizenship
- 15 Resume or detailed background report for all working applicants.
- 16 Eight passport size photos. Photos must be on a white background with ears showing.
- 17 Notarized copies of university/college diplomas, if applicable.
- 18 An original letter of recommendation from the Principal/Dean of the school or university for children aged between 12- 18 years.

All original documents that are not in the English language must be legally translated and notarised. We require the original and the translated copies.
